Re: CT Public Act 22-58 Private and Semipublic Well Water Testing for New Wells

Dear All,

Connecticut Public Act 22-58 (effective October 1, 2022) has changed the testing, reporting, and information storage of laboratory testing for private and semipublic drinking water wells. The State Department of Public Health released a circular letter (2002-60, attached) summarizing the changes, including the need for additional testing of <u>new</u> wells for lead, arsenic and uranium (in addition to Table 2 Basic Indicators Tests, attached).

Lastly, water testing information provided by a certified laboratory is now considered confidential, and thus will not be kept in the property files (as previously conducted). We will continue to work with our municipal building officials, property owners, builders and well drillers to ensure potability of new wells for the purposes of COs and property owners for testing and analysis of existing wells.
