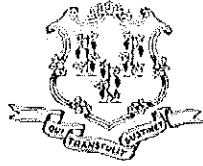

Dear Funeral Directors and Embalmers,

The Department understands that you have many questions regarding rapidly changing COVID 19 situation as it applies to your profession.

On March 16, Governor Lamont signed an executive order that prohibits large gatherings to a capacity of 50 people. As you are likely aware, this prohibition applies to funerals and wakes. Some funeral homes are livestreaming services and/or staggering visitors in order to adhere to the prohibition. All of these actions are ways to reduce the chance of spreading COVID 19.
