Please see the attached observation report:

Visual observations for Cyanobacteria were taken at Sears Park and adjacent property this morning. Conditions at the public swim area remain clear. No surface scums or mats were present at the public swim area. There were what appeared to be streaks of cyanobacteria mixed with pollen in the properties adjacent to Sears Park. In addition, reports from residents have observed other areas of the lake with what appear to be small accumulations of cyanobacteria.

### **The public swim area at Sears Park remains OPEN for swimming.**

Residents should avoid contact with water that looks green or blue-green throughout (sometimes described as looking like pea soup). Any mats, films, or scums on the surface of the water that are blue-green in color, look like spilled paint, or have a noxious odor should be reported to Chatham Health District and avoided.
