

## Cyanobacteria Observations at Sears Park DELAYED due to inclement weather

**Due to inclement weather, Chatham Health District will not be conducting observations or issuing a report for Cyanobacteria at Sears Park this week.** Chatham Health District did not receive any reports of surface scums, mats or films of Cyanobacteria on Lake Pocotopaug this week. There were no reports of adverse health impacts.

The current advisory will remain in effect.

Residents should avoid contact with water that looks green or blue-green throughout (sometimes described as looking like pea soup). Any mats, films, or scums on the surface of the water that are blue-green in color, look like spilled paint, or have a noxious odor should be reported to Chatham Health District and avoided.
